Entry and Rules.

1. Entry

1.1 The Challenge

Innovation in Public Health Engineering.

1.2 The Brief

This may be in any aspect relating to Public Health Engineering.

1.3 Entrants

Teams of up to 3 people, aged 18-30 on 23rd July 2010.

The entries will be in two separate phases:

Phase 1:

The competitors or teams should submit a single A3 sheet demonstrating the concept of their proposed innovation. The entries will be reviewed by a panel of judges, who will shortlist the best entries for progression to phase 2.

The submission should include:

- Name(s) of the participants their date of birth and contact details.
- Six paper copies should be provided.
- Additionally the competitors may also supply one CD with a pdf version of their submission

Phase 2:

The shortlisted entrants will be invited to expand and develop their ideas for presentation to a panel of judges. The successful candidate(s) will be advised of the number of teams shortlisted.

For this Phase of the competition the entrants should provide at the presentation the following:

- One paper copy of their presentation.
- One CD with a pdf version of their submission

1.4 The Prize

A trip for up to three adults to New York and Niagara Falls Including return flights from a London airport to New York and 4 night's hotel accommodation, room only.

2. Judging Criteria

In reaching their decisions the judges will take particular note of the quality of the proposal, fitness for purpose, originality, and application of research and findings benefit to the community, practical application.

3. Judging Process

The first phase will be for the judges to short list entries on the initial concept submitted.

Short listed teams or individuals will be invited to present their idea to the panel. They will be given the opportunity to make a short presentation (up to 20 minutes) followed by a 20 minute question and answer session.

4. The Judges

The judges will comprise of leading members from the design and construction/manufacturing industries and educational Institutions.

5. Presentation of the award

The award will be announced and presented at the annual SoPHE dinner in November 2010.

6. Competition terms and conditions

1. By entering into the competition, all entrants agree to be bound by the competition terms and conditions.
2. Closing date for entry is as stated. No entries will be accepted after the closing date.
3. Entries must be made via the specified entry mechanic.
4. One entry per person/Team
5. No alternative prize is available.
6. Winners will be chosen by a select panel of Judges.
7. The decision of SoPHE is final in all matters relating to the competition. No correspondence will be entered into.
8. Winners will be notified in writing.
