



CIBSE Membership Fact Sheet

Graduate – G20

Graduate membership of CIBSE is a transitional grade for those who are **working towards the ACIBSE or MCIBSE grades**. As a Graduate member you will normally be working in building services engineering undertaking Training and Development based on the Competence Criteria (see A21 and M21). You will be working towards achieving competence and assuming increasing responsibility towards that of a corporate member of the Institution.

Requirements

To become a Graduate member of CIBSE you need to have successfully completed one of the following:

- a Bachelors degree in an engineering, science or technology subject
- an MEng degree
- other qualifications accepted via the Individual Case Procedure (see below)
- degrees appropriately accredited by Washington Accord signatories are also accepted:

The Canadian Council of Professional Engineers

The Institution of Engineers, Australia

The Engineering Council of South Africa

The Institution of Engineers of Ireland

The Engineering Council, United Kingdom

The Institution of Professional Engineers, New Zealand

The Hong Kong Institution of Engineers

The United States Council for International Engineering Practice

Please note that in addition to a degree, further study may be required for future progression to Chartered Engineer registration, depending on accreditation status and date of commencement of the degree course.

Application Procedure

- **Complete the application form and submit it to CIBSE. If you are not currently in CIBSE membership please enclose also the appropriate application fee (see fact sheet I20)**
- **Give the name of one sponsor who can be a Fellow, Member or Associate of CIBSE, or other Engineering Institution**
- **Provide a copy of your degree certificate, countersigned as authentic by your sponsor. For qualifications that need to be assessed via the Individual Case Procedure, you should also include further details of your qualification such as a transcript of results and syllabus.**

Interim CEng registration with the Engineering Council(UK)

This is automatically open to Graduate members who hold qualifications which have already been accredited for Interim CEng registration. A complete list of these can be found on their website, www.engc.org.uk.

This level of registration signifies that you have met the first stage of registration, the academic requirement and that you are now working towards the competences of a Chartered Engineer. Full registration is gained by making an application for MCIBSE and attending a Professional Review Interview carried out by the Institution.

Qualification Assessment through Individual Case Procedure for interim registration

CIBSE recognises that many engineers hold engineering qualifications other than those which are specifically accredited. These will normally be either degrees obtained overseas or 'cognate' degrees, i.e. non-engineering degrees in disciplines with a strong science base. These types of qualifications will be assessed by the Individual Case Procedure Panel either before or at the time of application. Should you wish an assessment to be conducted prior to applying for Graduate membership, please request a Qualification Assessment form. Should the Individual Case Procedure Panel decide that further study is necessary in order to meet the requirements then you will receive guidance on how to achieve this.
