Annual Dinner 2015

Last year's successful inaugural UAE Group Dinner featured Australia-based CIBSE President Peter Kinsella who delivered the keynote speech despite the language difficulties (his native tongue being Strine). This year we expect to have an equally entertaining speaker to liven the event. It will be an excellent opportunity for CIBSE members to meet on a more sociable basis. The 2015 dinner is tentatively scheduled for May with the venue and final date yet to be confirmed.

Vertical Transportation Rises to the Occasion

Our recent seminar in December featured VTME Elevator Consultants and Schindler Middle East offer an enlightening presentation on an often overlooked essential item in building services - the humble elevator. VTME explained how sizing elevator shafts and machinery spaces can affect overall building costs and subsequent energy usage. In the course of the presentation we were reminded that the UAE is an earthquale zone and special codes need to be adopted in the design of elevators.

Schindler introduced their new transit management concept that in the wrong hands will lead us all to big brother. This exciting new technology can track who used the elevator, where they went, how long they stayed, and when they left the building. In the right hands, their technology can significantly reduce energy consumption and the number of elevators required for a building. The system can predict passenger use and preferences as well as providing security and efficiency.

Establishing Firm Roots as a Legal Entity

For those of you who have set up your own entities you will have some sympathy with our efforts to establish the UAE CIBSE Group as a legal entity. Without this legal status it is very difficult to operate, especially in respect to an office and bank facilities. After considerable investigation we have found ways and means to do this as an association. A serviced office has been found that suits our needs for both registration and a license. CIBSE headquarters have approved funding in principle and we are awaiting final approval to establish a permanent base in the UAE.

Local Links

Part of our responsibility as an engineering institution is to establish links with other likeminded organizations. We are developing closer ties with a number of organizations including the Emirates Green Building Council who have expressed a strong desire to work closely with CIBSE.

Young Engineers Network (YEN)

The YEN UAE Committee is now fully established. They are based across three emirates - Dubai, Abu Dhabi and Fujairah - and will be meeting on the last Monday of each month in Dubai to discuss social and technical events, mentorship, and other YEN matters.

The current committee is made of 10 general members and 10 acting officers covering the following roles; chair, vice chair, secretary, social officer, educational officer, technical officer. A communications officer is needed to increase the interaction with the various stakeholders; volunteers can apply to interim chair or vice chair at elie.elchoufani@atkinsglobal.com or imran@ckr.ae.

The YEN UAE are organizing their official launch event in March; all interested engineers are invited to participate in this gathering event.
